By organizing the International Conference on Literature (*ICL 2018*), we want to respond and contribute to current critical and theoretical debates by moving toward the study of world literatures and global theoretical, aesthetic and cultural practices. The conference also aims to trigger a debate about the future of the disciplines, and thus reinvigorate and pioneer certain dimensions of the areas. This two day event seeks to provide a platform for those interested in interdisciplinary and/or crosscultural approaches to push postcolonial and diaspora studies into new domains to meet, discuss, and to explore contemporary debates, and to revisit the 'classic' issues to interrogate them. Topics to be addressed by the papers and sessions at the conference will cover a broad spectrum of research questions, but with a specific emphasis on contemporary and future challenges for postcolonial and diasporic literature and theory.

We invite proposals for individual papers from academics in the humanities and social sciences to reassess contemporary perspectives on/in postcolonial and diasporic literature and theory. Possible topics may include, but are NOT limited to:

- Postcolonial and Diasporic Studies: Where Were We? Where Are We? Where To Now?
- Global South and Diasporic Studies
- Issues of Subjectivity
- Region, Religion, Politics, and Culture
- Race, Racism, Class, Gender, Sexuality, and Ethnicity
- Rethinking the Family, Sex, and Gender
- Migration, Diaspora, Hybridity, and Borders
- Bioethics, Ecology, Ecocriticism, Health, and Wellness
- War, Violence and Terror
- Islamic Postcolonialism
